"We aim to bring together the world's top experts on themes such as atmosphere, climate, water,

glaciers, agriculture and biodiversity, while taking stock of policies on development, health, energy and food security. With this opportunity, we will also showcase phase II of our SHARE (Stations at High Altitude for Research on the Environment) Project and its contributions to management-oriented research on climate change and mountain environments," stated a release issued by the Ev-K2-CNR

The mountains constitute an extraordinary platform for monitoring climate change and its effects, being representative of vast spatial areas and influencing local and global climates in ways that are only partially understood, states the release, adding, "we feel that concerned scientists not only have a responsibility to perform high altitude research and environmental monitoring to improve our knowledge of these issues, but also to raise public and government-level awareness on the implications of climate change in mountain areas, so as to help define mitigation and adaptation policies. The ultimate aim of these efforts should be to promote sustainable development of mountain ecosystems, which are crucial to ensuring wellbeing on the planet".
